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PRESIDENT'S REPORT



American Council for Construction Education (ACCE) is a 501(c)(3) private non-profit corporation. The mission of ACCE is to be a leading global advocate of quality construction education and to promote, support, and accredit quality construction education programs. The primary goal is the promotion and continued improvement of postsecondary construction education. Specifically, ACCE's primary focus is to accredit construction education programs in colleges and universities that request its evaluation and meet its standards and criteria.

ACCE was organized in 1974 by the American Institute of Constructors (AIC), the constructor's professional organization, and the Associated Schools of Construction (ASC). ACCE enjoys the support of many North American building and contracting associations and academic institutions seeking to satisfy the needs of highly qualified entry-level management personnel in the construction profession. We are having an exciting time as we celebrate our 50th anniversary! The celebration began at our Annual Conference in July 2024 and will continue through our Midyear Conference next February.

The Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA), based in Washington, DC, provides oversight of ACCE as the accrediting agency for the four-year baccalaureate degree, two-year associate degree, and master's degree programs in construction science, construction management, and construction technology programs. In October 2022, CHEA approved their recognition of ACCE for seven more years. In July 2023, CHEA approved a new Scope of Services for ACCE. This change will allow ACCE to provide accreditation services for single-purpose Institutions and international construction degree programs. We have completed the accreditation of our first single-purpose institution, Western States College of Construction in Denver, CO. We will be sending a Visiting Team to Lima, Peru, in September 2024 for the site visit of the first international program under our new CHEA scope, Universidad Peruana de Ciencias Aplicada's MS Degree in Construction Management.

Our Accreditation Committee and Visiting Teams were busy this past year. Based on their efforts and recommendations, the ACCE Board of Trustees granted eleven seven-year reaccreditation to existing construction degree programs. The Board approved one recommendation for accreditation from our Construction Workforce Education Committee, the Mid-American Carpenters Apprenticeship Programs located in Pekin, IL. There are now 99 ACCE-accredited programs in the United States and Canada.

Based on the requests from our industry constituents, ACCE offers a Professional Development Certification (PDC) Program. This program aims to recognize industry-related professional development training provided by educational institutions, industry associations, and private companies that meet ACCE criteria for certification. There are now ten ACCE-certified professional development programs.

We have three new Sustaining Association Members. Mr. Tim Mongeau will represent the Associated Builders and Contractors (ABC), and Mr. Barton James will represent the Air Conditioning Contractors of America (ACCA). Also, the National Housing Endowment (NHE) will have Ms. Karima Simmons represent them on our Board. Karima had been the Trustee for the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB). With her move to the NHE, Mr. Greg Zick will return to represent the NAHB as their Trustee.

We have started incorporating HVACR programs into ACCE. The Residential Heating and Air Conditioning training program provided by ITEC Training and Education Center in Rochester, NY, has received our Professional Development Certification. There are now three HVACR degree programs that have applied for degree accreditation. Two programs are at Pennsylvania College of Technology (an AAS Degree and a BS Degree) and the AAS Degree Program at St. Philips College in San Antonio, TX. They will submit their initial documents for review during the 2025 fiscal year.

Our Construction Workforce Education Committee (CWE) has created its Visiting Team Training Programs. They are in the process of updating their set of 200-series documents. Also, we now have three additional programs that have applied for our CWE accreditation. See the list of programs on page 16 of this document.

Another new service ACCE will present to our constituents is the Teaching and Learning Practitioners (TLP) program. Created by Dr. Tony Lamanna, Dr. John Tingerthal, and Professor Tom Leathem, this program aims to assist new instructors of courses and training programs to become fully competent and confident in their teaching skills. The TLP sessions have been presented at three ACCE Conferences and will be taken on the road to an industry organization located in Pennsylvania this November.

ACCE has developed reciprocal agreements with the National Board for Construction Management Accreditation (NBCMA) of the People's Republic of China and The Chartered Institute of Builders (CIOB) in the United Kingdom. These agreements recognize university degree programs accredited by NBCMA and CIOB as equivalent to Baccalaureate Degree Programs or Associate Degree Programs accredited by ACCE and the same equivalency for NBCMA and CIOB accredited Degree Programs. This past year, we renewed our agreement with CIOB. The Board created the International Programs Taskforce, led by Dr. Richard Burt, to explore other possible reciprocity agreements and potential foreign CM degree programs for accreditation.

Our recent successes happened because of a very devoted and passionate set of volunteer leaders at ACCE.

BOARD CHAIR'S REPORT



On behalf of the Board of Trustees, it gives me great pleasure to present the ACCE Annual Report for 2023-24. I would like to recognize and thank all my colleagues from ACCE for their active participation in committee meetings both virtual and in person throughout the year. It is truly the dedication and time commitment from each one of you to support continuous improvement and quality assurance of construction education at ACCE accredited programs. ACCE continues to remain strong and is increasing our sphere of influence within our goal to ensure excellence in construction education. Our President Steve Nellis continues to uncover and relentlessly pursue an expanding array of opportunities for ACCE's broadened scope. Through his efforts ACCE now has 13 Sustaining Association partners. We remain grateful to the countless volunteers from industry, associations and academia who selflessly commit their time to support the shared vision and goals.

In July 2023, ACCE held a successful Annual Meeting at Salt Lake City where President Steve Nellis reported that CHEA has approved ACCE scope change request, allowing us to operate worldwide and to accredit single purpose associate degree granting institutions. ACCE's expanded scope from CHEA requires a second institution accreditation by April 2025, to enable ACCE to continue accreditation of single purpose institutions. The Construction Work Force Committee is actively pursuing and mentoring several programs in the pipeline, who expressed interest in accreditation of single purpose institutions.

In February 2024, ACCE held its Midyear Meeting successfully in Las Colinas, Texas along with the second annual Construction Education Consortium (CEC) to pool resources of American Institute of Constructors (AIC), National Association of Women in Construction (NAWIC) and National Education Foundation (NEF). The CEC enabled collaboration, networking and cost sharing for all the organizations involved. This is one example of collaboration. The Midyear Meeting was preceded by the 13th Industry Advisory Board (IAB) Forum coordinated by ACCE's Industry Liaison Committee. Paul Mattingly led this successful event, drawing newcomers from near and far to empower advisory board members to become stronger advocates for their respective programs. Paul is exploring newer formats, agendas and forum location for future.

Congratulations to Western States College of Construction (WSCC) and the College President Dr. Mostafa Khattab who received One Million Dollar grant through a line item included in a recent approval from the Congress of the United States. WSCC was the first Construction Workforce Education Accredited Single Purpose Institution authorized to issue occupational associate degrees.

The 2024 Annual Meeting deserves special mention because of the quality of meeting rooms with appropriate audio-visual (AV) arrangements that ensured successful training and interaction among the meeting participants. Because of AV, the New Member Board Training became easy to deliver and receive by those present. In addition, we all witnessed the value and impact of EventMobi which practically replaced the primordial conference handbooks. EventMobi became a useful tool for the Annual 2024 Meeting because all Executive Committee Members provided meeting agendas and past meeting minutes in a timely manner. Thank you, committee chairs, you made the utility of EventMobi possible.

I am very grateful to the Awards and Scholarship Committee and its Chair Ms. Karima Simmons for recommending award of the ACCE National Housing Endowment Scholarship to Carla Robinson of Albany Georgia, a Dupree Scholarship to Cayla Thomas of Moore, South Carolina and a Dupree Scholarship to Gerald Giordano of Michigan State University. Carla is pursuing a master's degree at Tuskegee University, and Cayla is a doctoral student at Clemson University. Each scholarship award recipient receives \$5,000.00 for use towards educational expenses towards the goal of becoming a Construction Management faculty member. Congratulations to the three scholarship recipients!

Extra ordinary support was observed for the Teaching and Learning Practitioner (TLP) Program and Kudos to Dr. Tony Lamanna and his colleagues for their efforts. The Board of Trustees approved revisions to Document 103, Appendix H-A and H-B to initiate accreditation of associate degree Programs in Heating Ventilation, Air Conditioning and Refrigeration (HVACR) and bachelor's degree HVACR Programs. ACCE's new initiative

to include HVACR program and efforts to bring them under ACCE's umbrella deserves support from all of us. Mr. Michael Copp has defined ACCE process for integrating different type of HVACR Programs, including accreditation of bachelor's and associate degrees, Work Force apprenticeship Programs, and Certification of Professional Development Programs.

Many thanks to Mr. Rogers Hunt for leading the monitoring and update of ACCE's Strategic Plan, which is critical to meet the challenges and changing needs of the Construction Industry. I am looking forward to participation of my colleagues in the Strategic Planning Retreat scheduled for November 7-9, 2024, in Irving, Texas. President Nellis has also hired a Facilitator for coordinating the Strategic Planning Event, which will be preceded by inviting input from ACCE stakeholders including accredited Program Chairs, Construction Industry Practitioners, Executive Committee Members, and current Trustees.

My gratitude is also due to our exceptional Secretary, Dr. Sarel Lavy, for his service during 2023-2024. I am thankful to the Executive Committee members listed below, who chair Board and Special Committees entrusted with all functions of our Council on behalf of the trustees.



There are two initiatives in the offing that will expand and inspire addition of new programs to the list of ACCE accredited Programs. The first is implementing a procedure for categorization of ACCE accredited Programs as STEM designated in terms of Department of Homeland Security "STEM fields" that qualify Foreign Students for longer-duration of Optional Practical Training. Implementation of such a procedure will qualify all accredited programs to be STEM programs and will benefit each program in terms of increase in enrollment of foreign students. ACCE has created a Task Force lead by Dr. Chris Gordon to identify a methodology for STEM designation of ACCE accredited Programs. The second initiative pertains to formulation of two new Appendices by the Standards Committee for Document 103. These Appendices shall empower ACCE to accredit Fire Emergency and Disaster Management (FEDM) Programs, and Concrete Industry Management (CIM) Programs. The second initiative is led by Dr. Chuck Berryman, Chair of the Standards Committee.

The year 2024-25 will be challenging for ACCE with so many opportunities in front of us to fulfill the recently authorized expanded scope of operations. ACCE will send out more Visiting Teams for accreditation visits as compared to the past few years. I am grateful and would like to recognize the commitments and contributions of all the volunteers for their efforts to keep ACCE on the leading edge with regards to quality construction education. I would like to acknowledge the support and assistance I received from Dr. John Schaufelberger and Charlie Roesset, past Board Chairs, during my transition to Board Chair. I am also grateful to President Steve Nellis and Dr. Sherry Miller, Manager Accreditation, Certification, and Membership for providing me with advice and assistance when needed. I personally want to thank ACCE Vice Chair, Mr. Rogers Hunt, for his endeavors to ensure ACCE's brighter future through new attendees.

This is an exciting time in ACCE's 50-year history, and we are proud to launch our new strategic planning exercise in November. I will appreciate your involvement in doing the preparation work prior to the Strategic Planning Retreat. We will chart a course with our mission, goals, and priorities— all strongly rooted in our history, and boldly reimagine for the new heights we will achieve together.

I am confident that ACCE will achieve international prominence as an accreditation agency for Post-Secondary CM Programs known for partnership with the construction industry, market share, and ability to mentor programs to enable continuous quality improvement.
